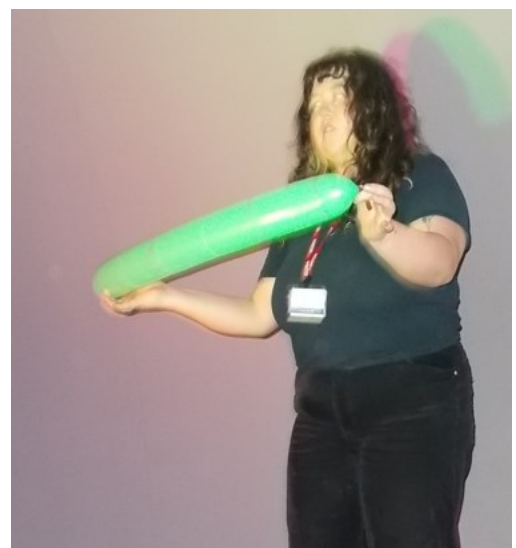
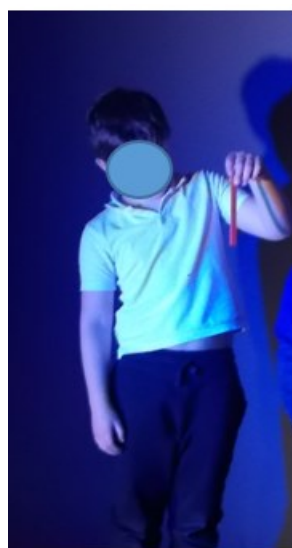
# SCIENCE DAY
